phrase we hear from time to time. The phrase originates from the early church father Augustine. A letter he wrote contains the phrase which translated means "With love for

hating the sin from love's (agape) perspective.


I have always been intrigued by Psalm 103 when it says, "The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love. He will not always accuse, nor will He



Sunday Worship Prep

Practical Implications of Divine Love "Loving the Sinner."

John 3:16-17 For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him."

Pastor's Message: Loving the Sinner. DESPISING the sin!!!

primary purpose is to redeem, not to condemn!!! In fact, the Bible says it very clearly multiple times over, especially in John 3:17, "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him." So, without argument, God loves everyone, including the sinner. And, so should we.

But God also ***hates*** sin! I can't say this strong enough!!! The reason is important: Because sin breaks God's heart! It messes up His plan, His intention and His purpose. God hates sin because it destroys His creation, it separates us from Him. Its

power is destructive, because it perverts not only the behavior but the one who exhibits the behavior.



God hates sin because it enslaves us and will eventually destroy us.

God hates sin because it messes up His perfect image in us; sin makes us look less and less like Him when we are to be continually transformed into Christ's image.

Sin messes everything up!

...and it breaks His heart!!! In the days of Noah the scripture states that God's heart was "deeply troubled." (Genesis 6:6, NIV) Literally translated it says, "His heart was injured." God's heart was injured over the sin of His creation.

I think the message is clear: loving the sinner is a matter of the heart—a heart moved with grace filled empathy and a heart broken with compassion.
