We put a huge emphasis in a call to worship, we provide a place for it and have a process through which we are led. However, do we understand the dynamic value of Sunday mornings at 11:00 a.m.?


Coming together for worship on Sunday is an opportunity for God to release His power and authority on His people. And here are the reasons:

- First, God lives in our worship. Psalm 22:3-4 tells us that as we worship Him (honor and praise) he "inhabits" those praises; He draws near. There is a dynamic here that must be understood. When we focus on Him we focus on ourselves less and because of that humble position God has the freedom to be active in our lives.
- Second, God acts through our worship. James 4:8 tells us that when we
 worship we are drawing near to God. God's response is to draw near to us
 and bring transformation in our lives. By the way, that's a promise!
- Third, God acts through our connection with others. The Bible says "Where two or three are gathered together in My Name, I am in their midst." Matthew 18:20. There is a miraculous dynamic that happens when we meet in worship. The gathering invites God's presence. Need I say more?

It is God's presence that saves, transforms, cleanses, empowers and sends. And it is gathering for worship that becomes the gateway for His presence. Make Sunday worship a priority. And when you come, expect to experience the real, dynamic and transforming presence of God. As we regather, let's consider our purpose and God's desire. Let's be open to God's work, ready to let God change us and make us what He desires.

Our prayer focus for November is the group of ten islands off the coast of Africa called Cabo Verde. The Nazarene missions work was established here in 1901 making this one of the oldest works within our denomination. The church is so well-established that the missionaries have long-since turned over the work to the nationals. The challenges of Covid-19 have been felt by the Cabo Verde church. But there have also been blessings...

- A national TV broadcast of a church service was developed for the first time in the country's history! 10:00 AM Primetime!
- The Cabo Verde church has been recognized by their government for the work they have done in the community during the pandemic

Prayer requests:

- Financial stability of the church and its members
- For young people to respond to the call of ministry (about 46% of the population is under the age of 25)
- For wisdom for the pastors and leaders as they seek to reach out to their communities with the Gospel in new ways during this pandemic

The Legacy Project

Although the pipe organ is not "essential" for worship or to the overall value of this great church, it is important to us as a historic jewel and blessing to traditional music and worship. The Leadership Board has approved the designation of a fundraising project to raise \$80,000.00 to have the organ removed, rebuilt and replaced in working order.

This will be accomplished on multiple levels:

- 1—Contacting organ guilds and historical organizations.
- 2—Private funding and grants.
- 3- Community Involvement.
- 4- CVNaz Funding Campaign

Funding Campaign: The Legacy Project.
